Due to the COVID-19 pandemic we had to pivot and migrate our events to an on-line platform and also cancel large scale programs that allowed us cost savings. In addition, we utilized the temporary Chancellor's funding to cover our Citrus Shared Services fees. Therefore, we have a carryforward of \$29,472.

Overview of Programs, Services, Staffing, & Support

Budget Item: Student Life Dev. Specialist 2

With the growing trend of student enrollment, high impact, and high level of programming the need to increase the office staff was crucial therefore the majority of our funds are allocated towards our Stdt Life Dev. Specialist 2 position. The additional staff member has expanded our ability to implement a comprehensive set of social, cultural, educational development programs for the UC Riverside community, especially as related to our Peer Mentor Program, annual programs (Semana de la Mujer, Raza Grad, Youth Conference) and MUNDO. Provide a liaison with Chicano/Latino student organizations. In addition to programming this allowed, us to help ameliorate the workload of our current staff and provide full time front desk coverage and office management. The temporary position ended in August 2019.

We redirected funds to Student Development and Programming and Campus wide programming which included post grad preparation.

Budget Item: Loan Programs

For students facing financial hardship, we offer a helpful loan program through our lending library. The cost of textbooks and clickers are often high, and can add a financial burden for students. Our loan program alleviates that stress by allowing students to check out and return textbooks and clickers, as they need them. We purchased additional clickers and books that we added to our lending library. In addition, we housed 20 clickers in the MUNDO LLC for residents.

Budget Item: Student Development and Programming

Through the funds we were able to provide comprehensive programs and services that support and promote student academic, interpersonal, and career development. This allows to empower students to thrive and grow academically, intellectually, emotionally, physical, and socially. In addition to programs we were able to fund student travel and programs such as the UC Davis Thailand Internship, Hip Hop Youth Research & Advocacy Conference, SACNAS National Conference, WERC Environmental Design Contest, International Conference on Robotics & Automation, Hispanic Studies Spain Internship, American Annual Meeting Division of Fluid Dynamics, USI conference, UC Irvine Leadership Conference and the Mujer Conference. In addition, we supported student organization efforts such as Raza Assembly, Mujeres Unidas, Underground Scholar Initiatives and R'Kids.

Budget Item: General Operating Costs

We purchased general office supplies, computer software (MCAA renewal & Adobe), parking permits (TAPS), facilities, and helped support recurring monthly charges such as the copier lease.

Budget Item: Marketing

In addition to increase visibility and branding our office purchased insignia items such as staff polos, shirts, a canopy and new trifold brochures.

Budget Item: Staff Professional Development

Currently, money allocated for professional development is highly limited; thus, restricting opportunities for staff and student development. Through this fund, we are able to attend meetings, conferences, etc. The Director and Assistant Director attended the Chicanx Latinx Leadership Conference. The assistant director attending the NASPA Conference and AAHHE Conference. We also funded our membership for the California Council of Cultural Centers in Higher Education.

Budget Item: RSAC Support

The center provided a \$500 stipend per quarter plus benefits to the student representative on the Referendum Student Advisory Committee. In addition, we supported copy and meal costs for RSAC meetings.

Budget Item: Diversity Council Support and Development

Funds were used to support basic needs.

Budget Item: CSS Fees

Due to a one-time funding allocation we did not have to use our HESSR funds to cover these fees. We redirected these funds to our Campus wide programming.
