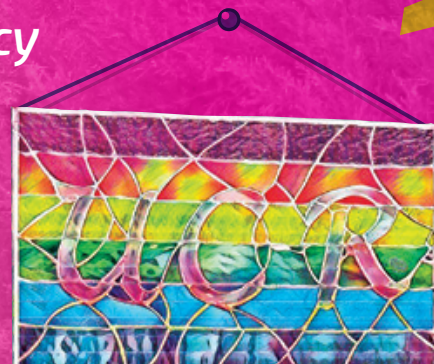




**UCR Makes Strides In Understanding and Respecting Gender Diversity**

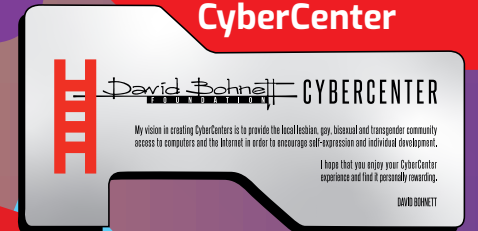

We offer supportive spaces where students can ask questions, share thoughts, explore ideas, make connections, and grow.

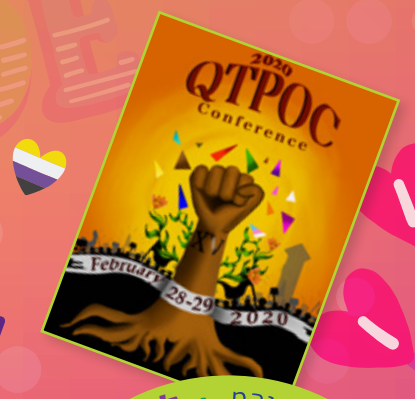

## Educational Trainings & Presentations

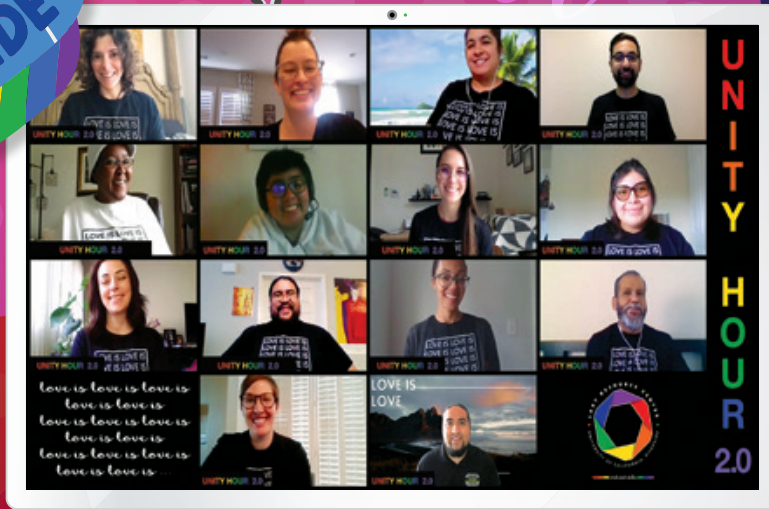
We educate others about sexual orientation and gender identity, creating a more LGBT-inclusive campus community.

## History

*The first Pride was a riot at the Stonewall Inn bar in New York City in 1969, led by trans women of color like Marsha P. Johnson, Sylvia Rivera and Miss Major. In response to a police raid, Stonewall Inn patrons and others fought back against police violence in the streets. The uprising became the catalyst for an emerging LGBTQ rights movement that used protests and direct challenges of political leaders to advocate for change. Within a year, the first "Gay Pride" marches raised national visibility of the LGBTQ community.*

## 4 Scholarships & Financial Aid Funds Helping Students

The UCR campus community, alumni, and friends support LGBTQ+ students through merit scholarships and emergency financial aid funds, including the **Dr. Eugene A. Moynier Student Award** and the **LGBTQIA+ Student Leadership Scholarship** recognizing student excellence, and **Kalyn Smith-Tranquil'son Memorial Fund** and the **LGBTRC Student Assistance Fund** to help students in economic crisis.
