

## **UC Riverside Grading Scale**

## The University of California, Riverside has the following grade options:

Letter Grade	Satisfactory / No Credit
A+ A A- B+ B B- C+ C C- D+ D D- F	S (satisfactory) NC (no credit)

Use the following scale to determine the appropriate S or NC mark for a student:

Grade	Undergraduate Student	Graduate Student
S	"C" 2.0 equivalent or higher	"B" 3.0 equivalent or higher
NC	"C-" or below. Less than a 2.0	"B-" or below. Less than a 3.0

## Other Grading Marks:

I (incomplete): Incomplete (I) grades should only be assigned to students whose work is of passing quality and incomplete for good cause with whom you have an agreement for the completion of coursework. Students have until the end of the following term (excluding summer) to complete their work, otherwise the incomplete will lapse to an "F". Graduating students do not have this completion period.

**IP** (in progress): In progress grades are assigned for courses that extend for more than one quarter. When the final quarter of the course is taken and graded, the IP grades will be automatically replaced with the final earned grade. Incompletes should not be used for a course graded on an IP basis.

**GD (grade delay):** A grade delay (GD) issued by an instructor indicates that you are proceeding with an investigation into an academic integrity violation with Student Conduct & Academic Integrity Programs (SCAIP). It should never be entered as a placeholder by an instructor.

GD grades are also populated by the Office of the Registrar as a placeholder for missing grades not submitted by the grading deadline. These are replaced when the instructor submits grades for the course.

## **Common Questions:**

**Does UCR have a pass/fail grading basis?** Yes, but it is specific to the School of Medicine. Satisfactory/No Credit (S/NC) is the more common grade mode at UCR (see above).

What does "Grade Basis" mean in iGrade? The grading basis is part of the course approval process and defines what grade marks are available for a particular course. Depending on your specific course, students may be enrolled with various grading bases. Common values include:

- L = Letter Grades Only
- P = S/NC Grades Only (Letter grades are converted to their S/NC equivalency)
- **B** = Letter and S/NC Grades Available
- IP = Course may extend for more than one term and In Progress (IP) grades are available
- N = Not Gradable (for secondary course activities, such as discussions)
