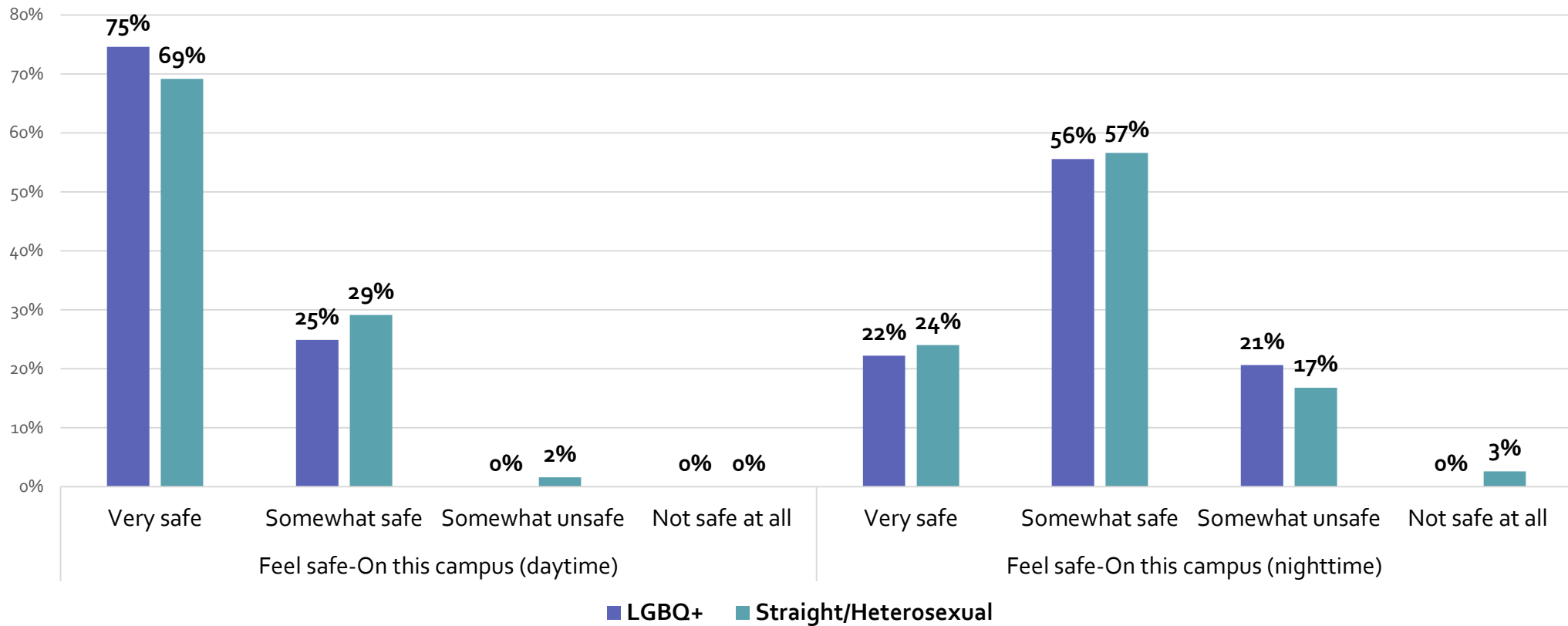

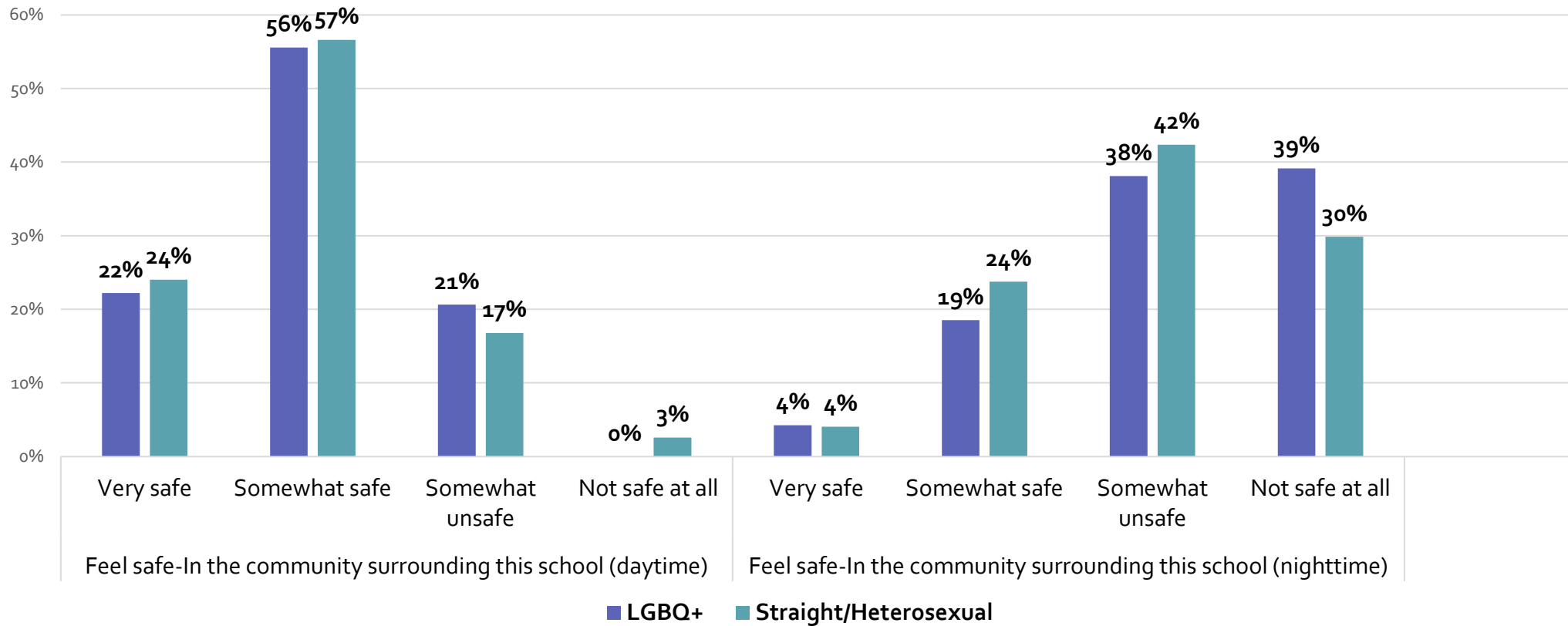

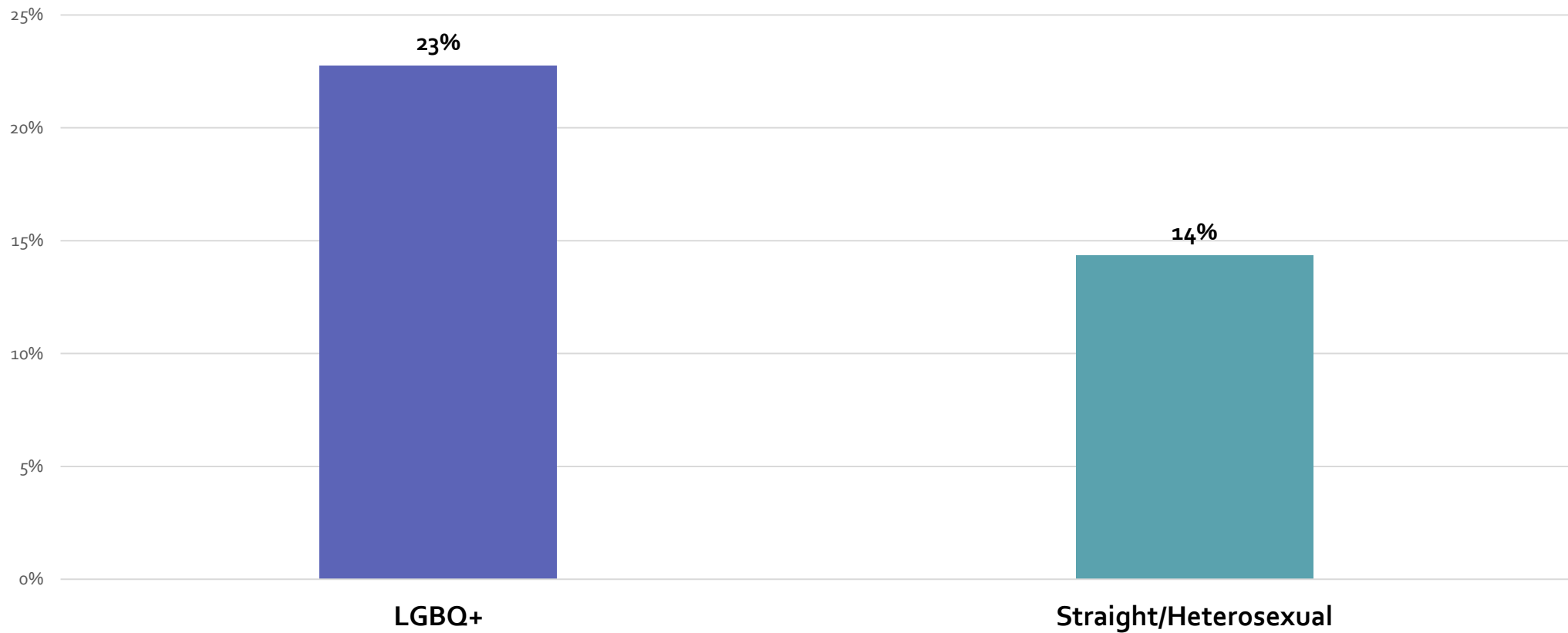

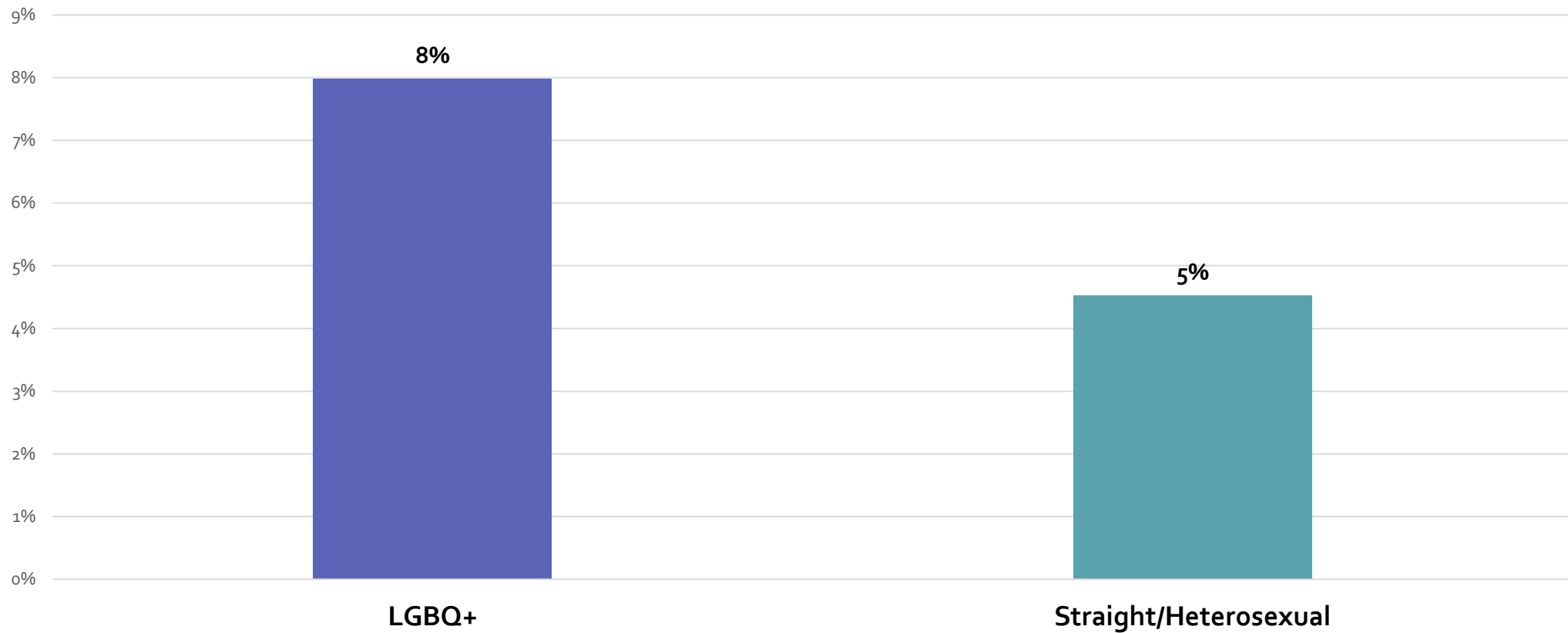
Community Safety



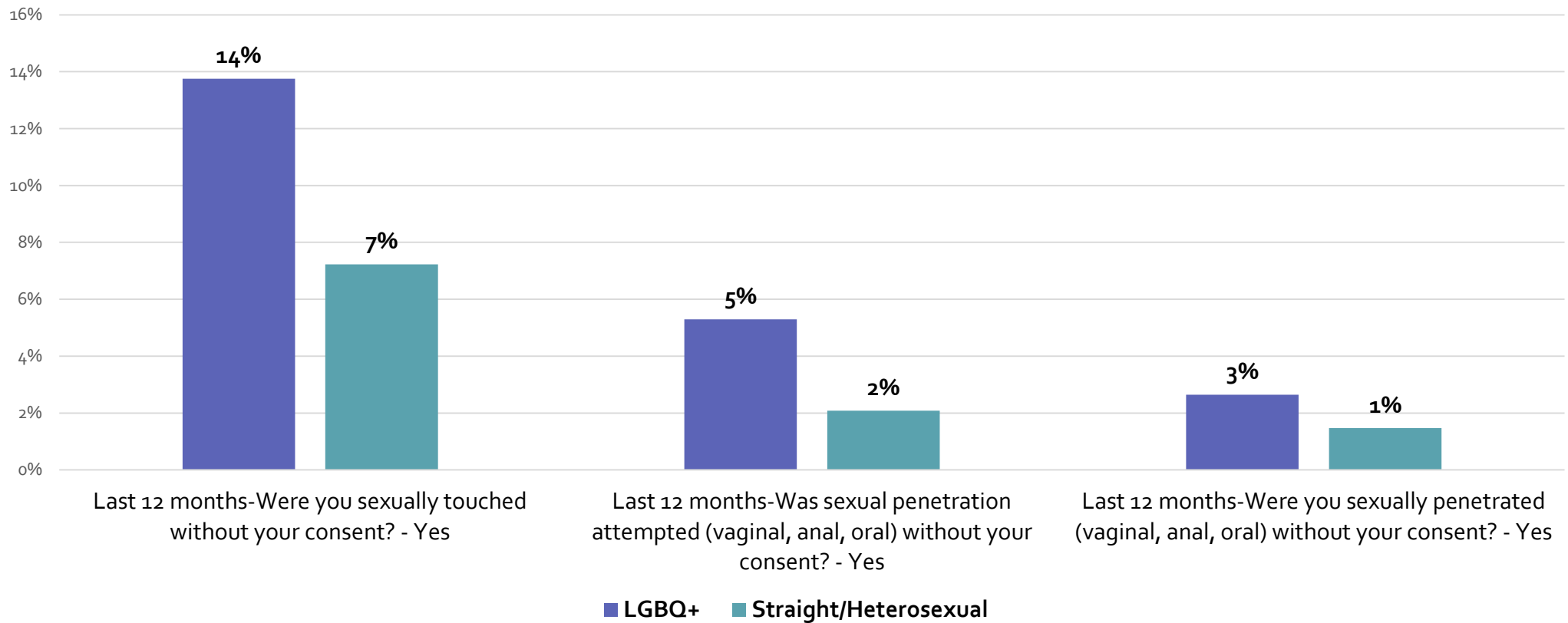
Last 12 months-Were you verbally threatened?



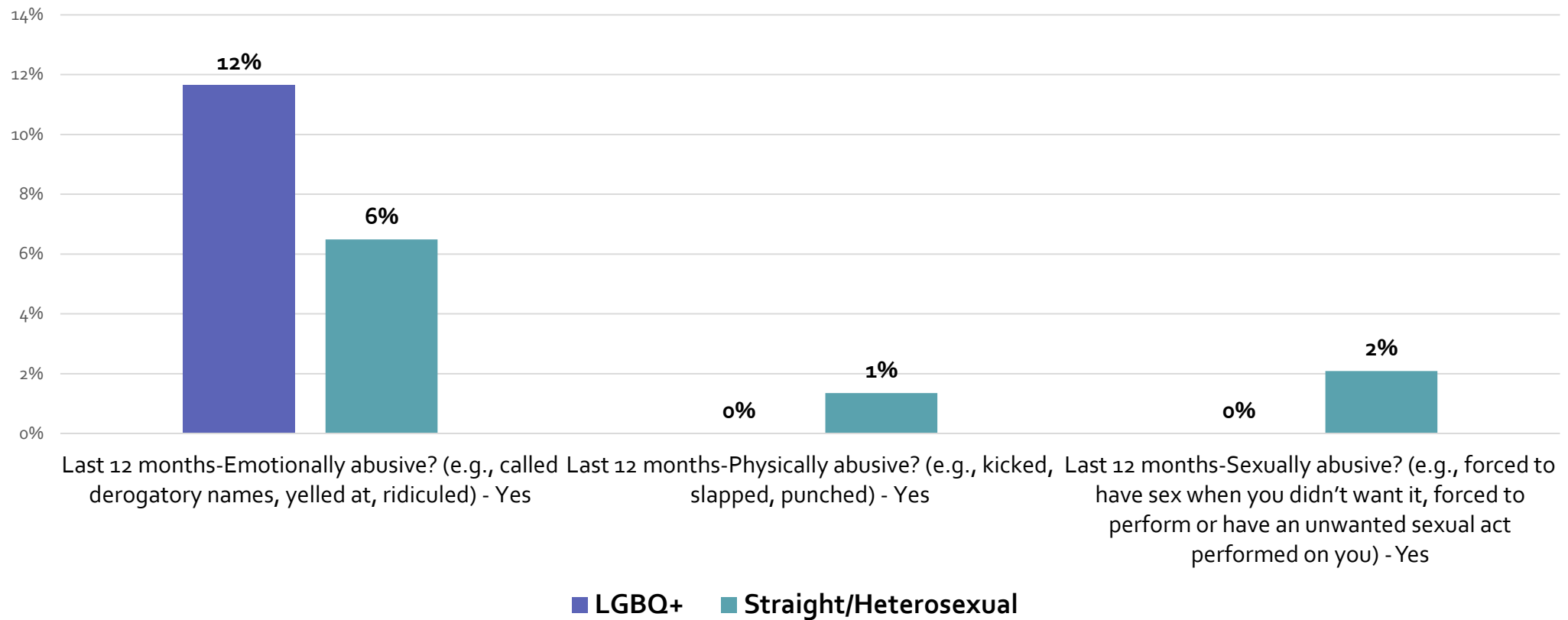
Stalking: Last 12 months-Were you a victim of stalking?

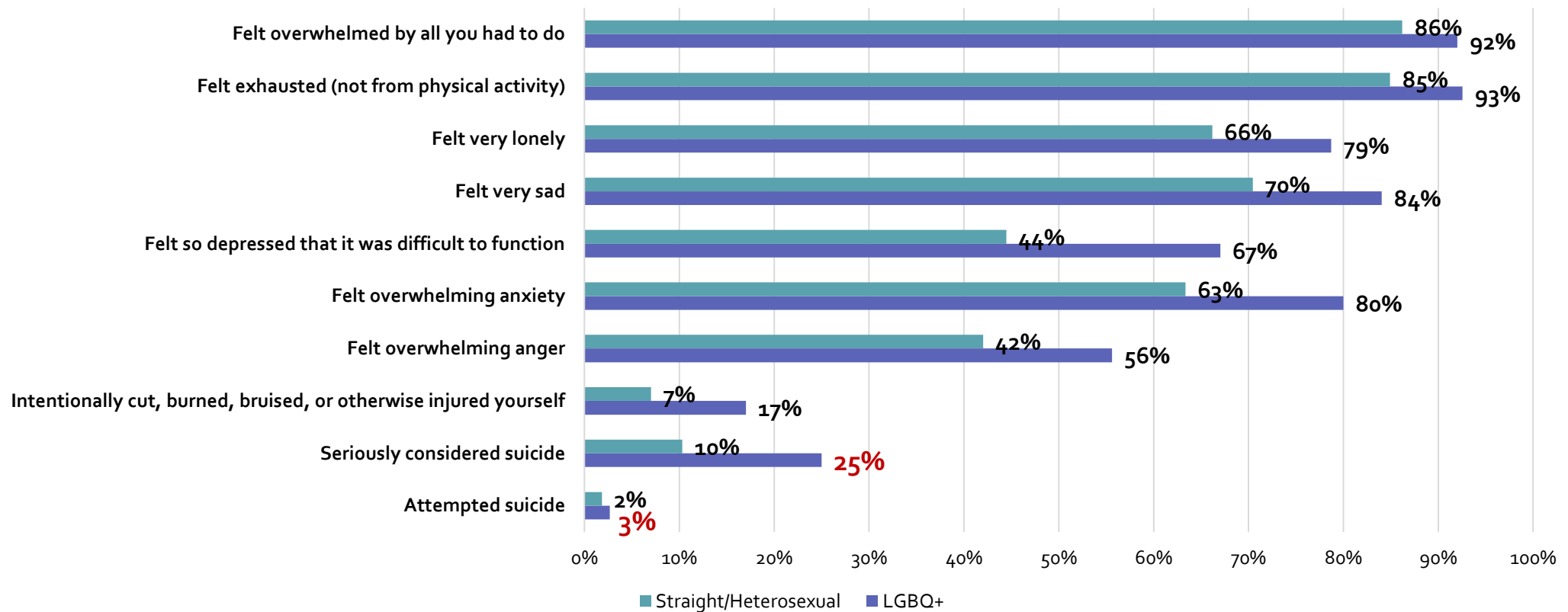

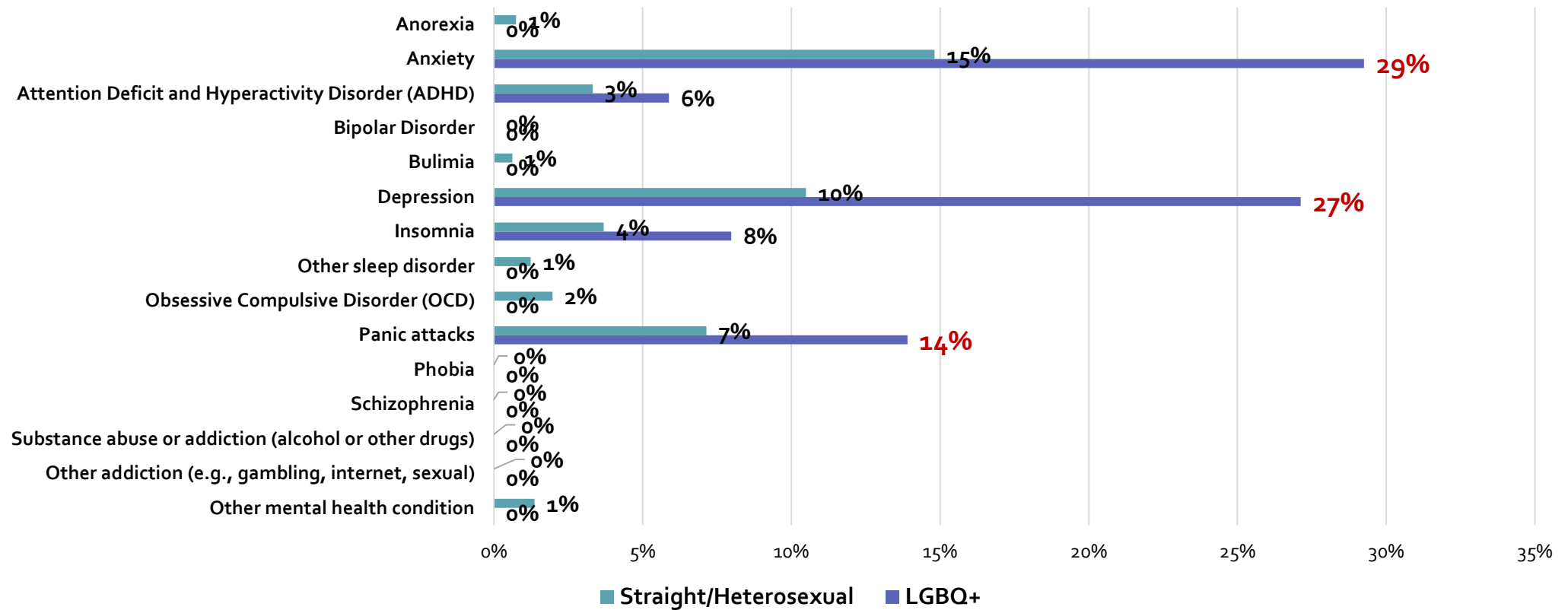

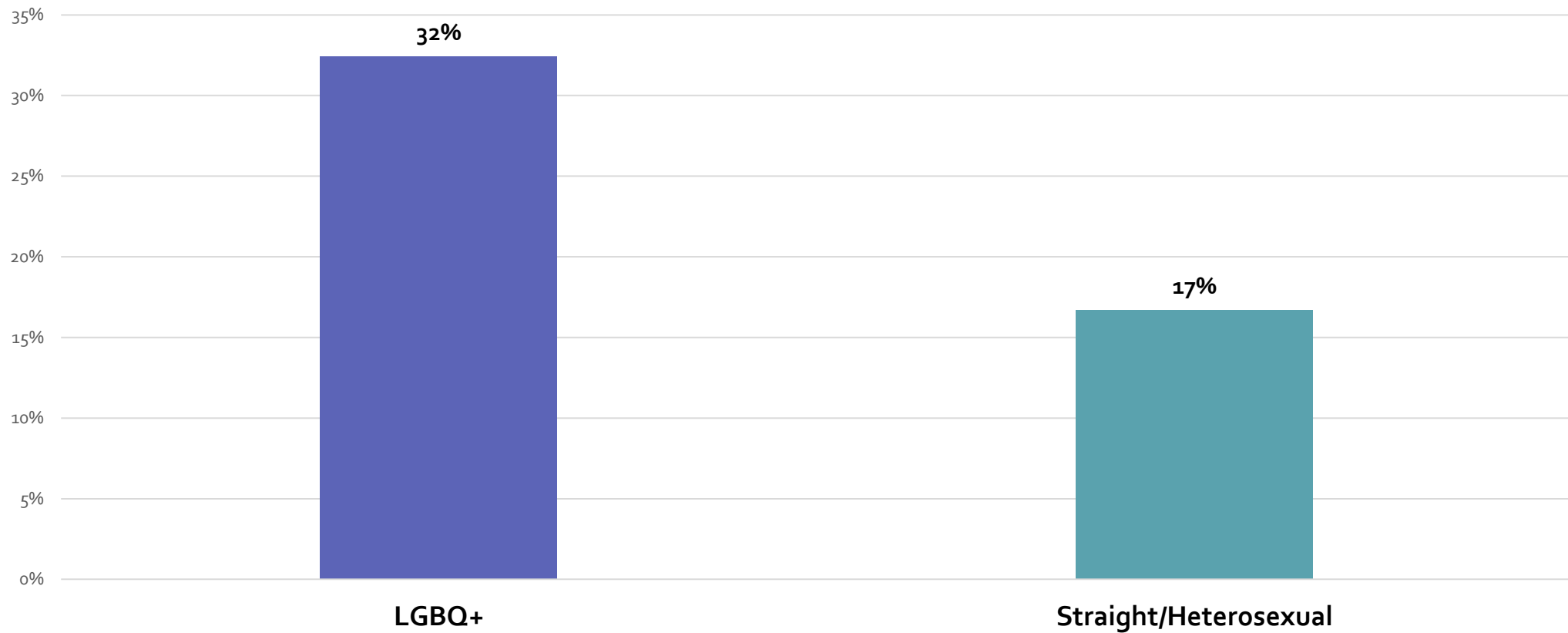
Behaviors in the Last 12 Months



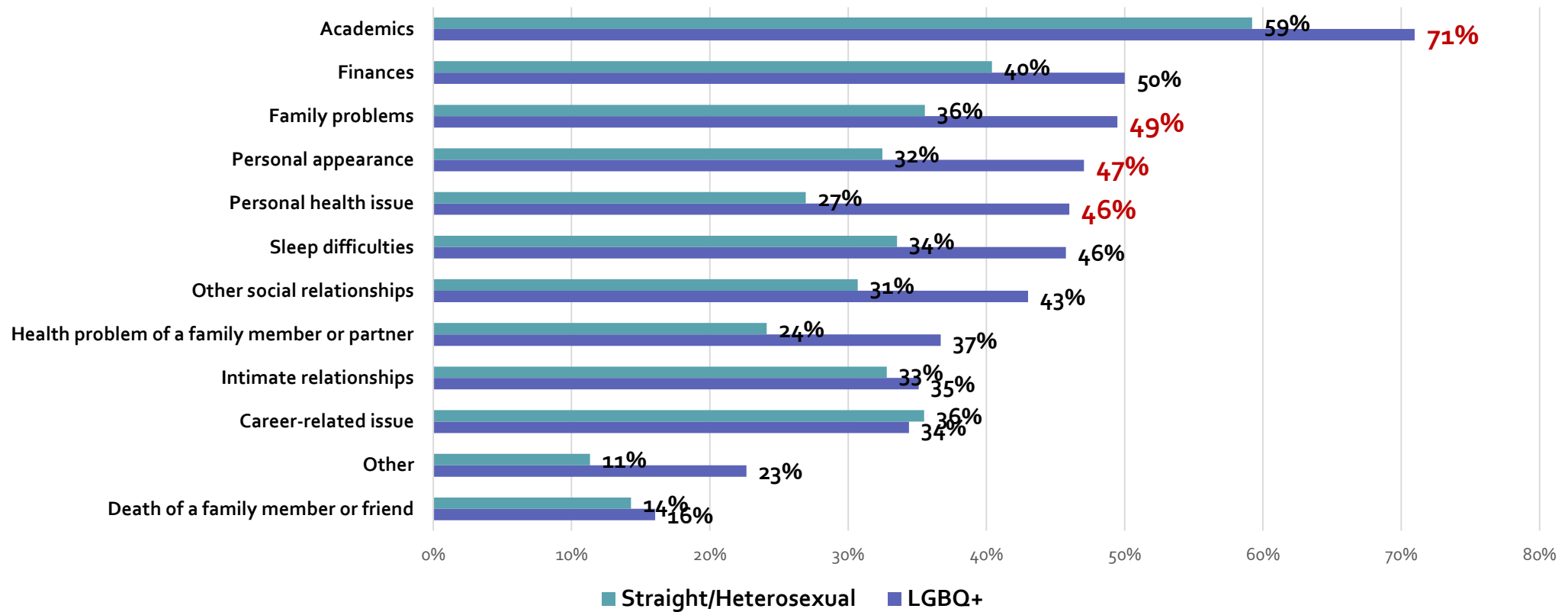
Diagnosed/Treated in Last 12 Months



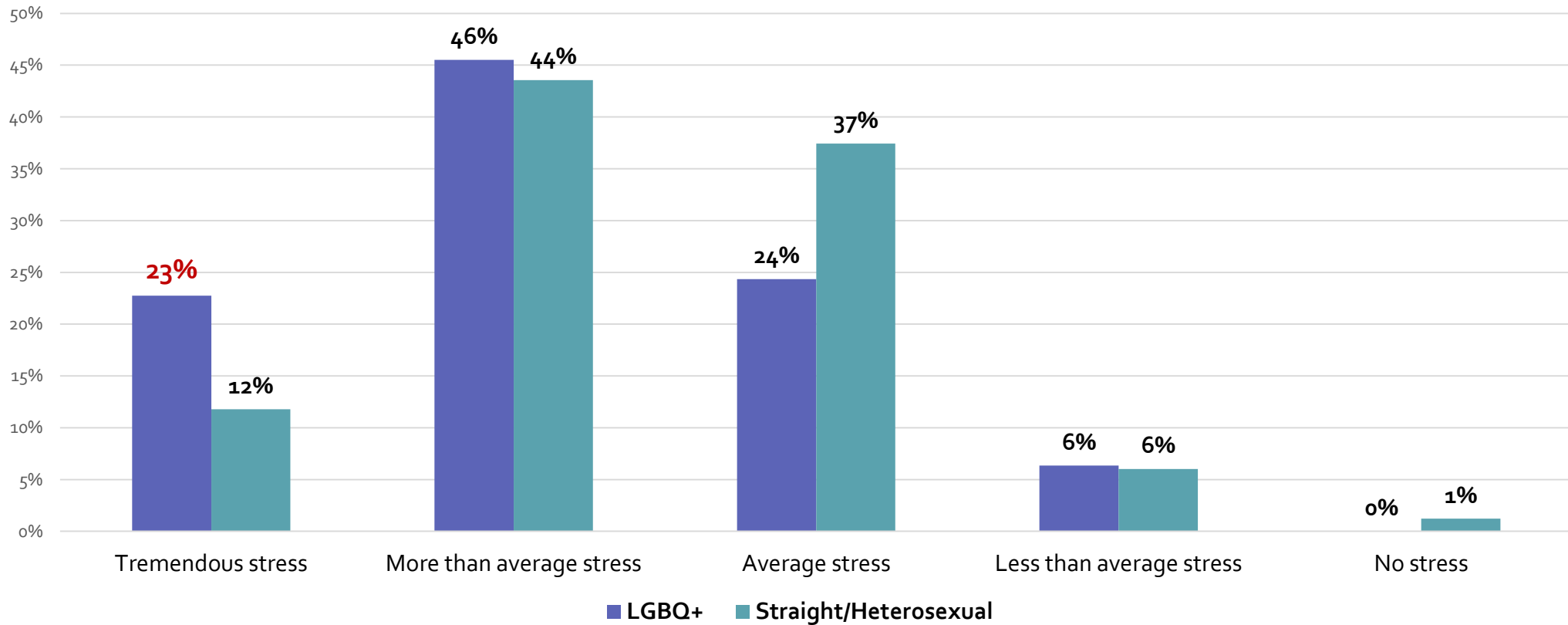
Depression: Ever Diagnosed



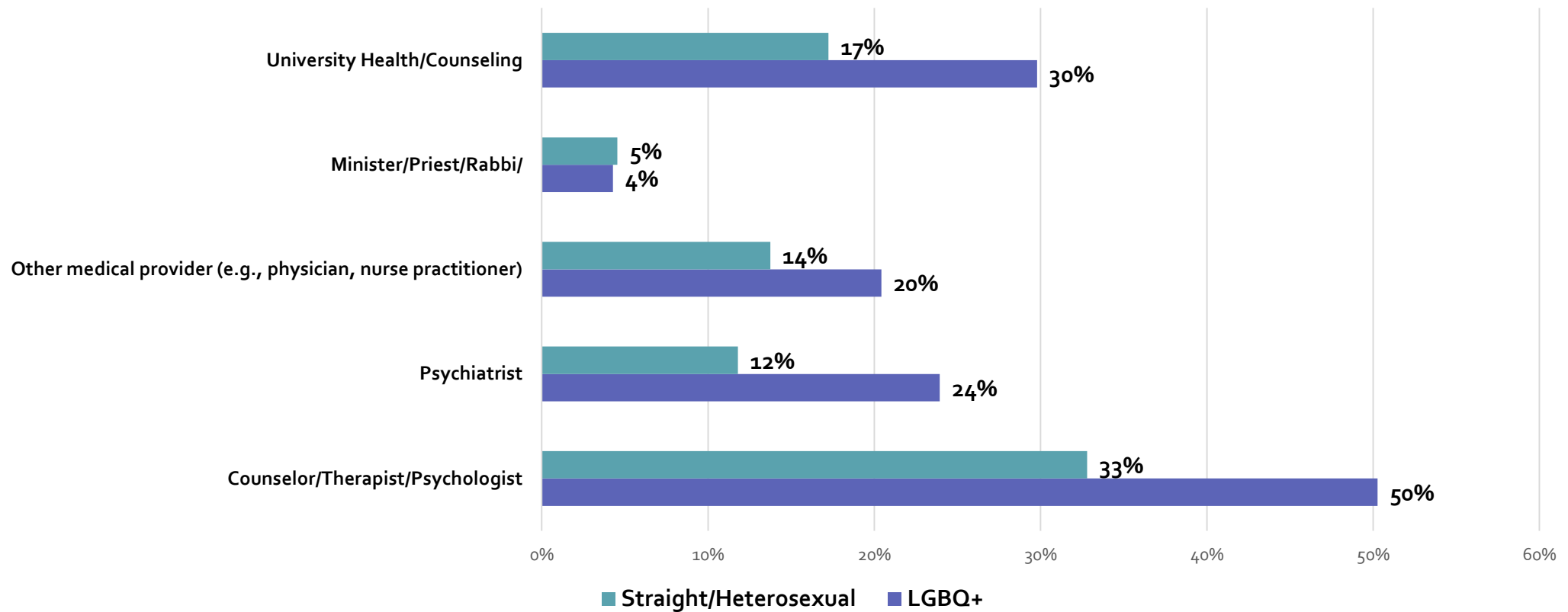
Last 12 Months Difficult to Handle



Stress in the Last 12 Months

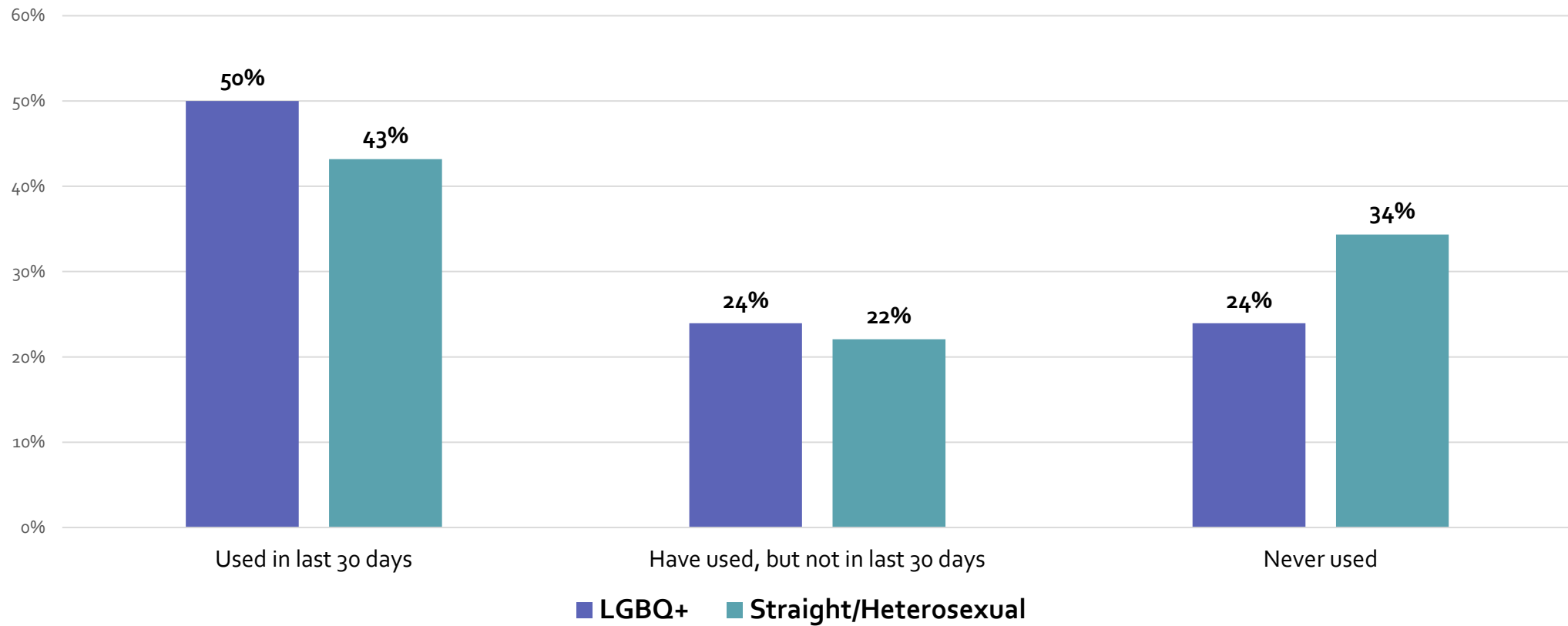


Ever Received Mental Health Services

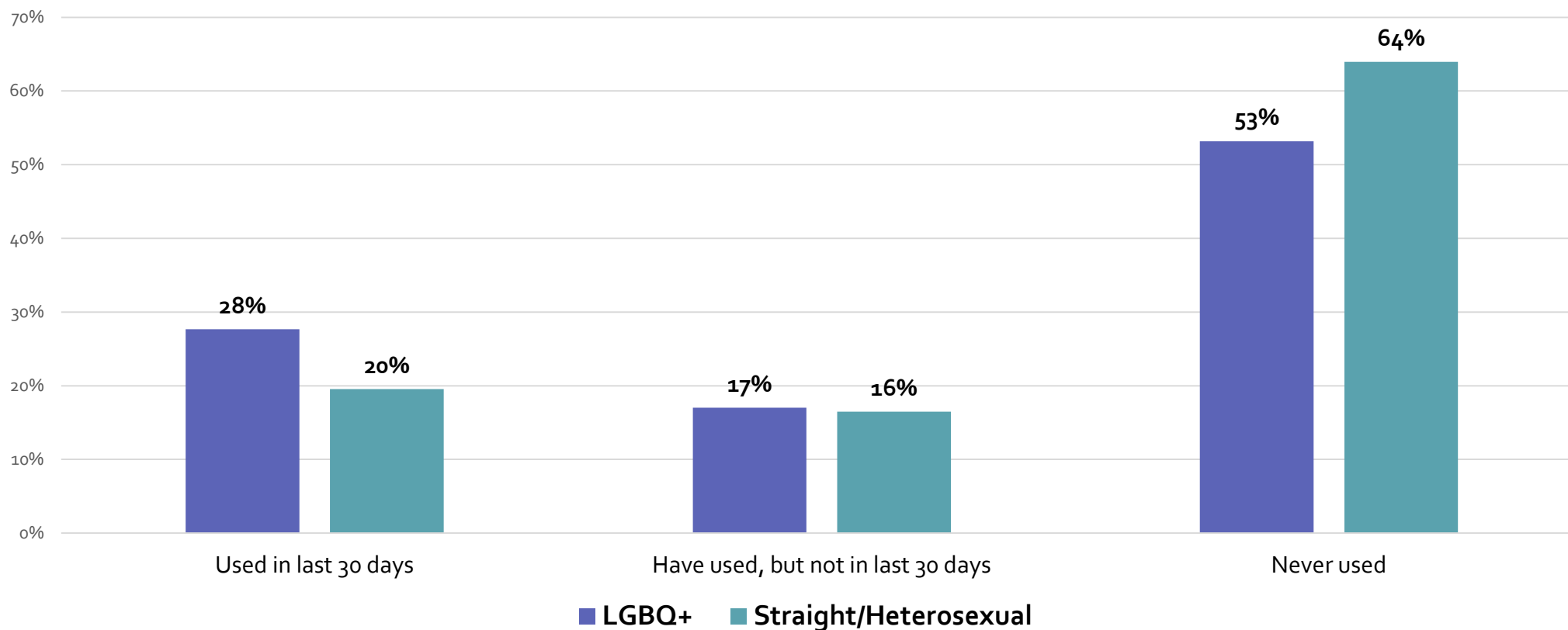

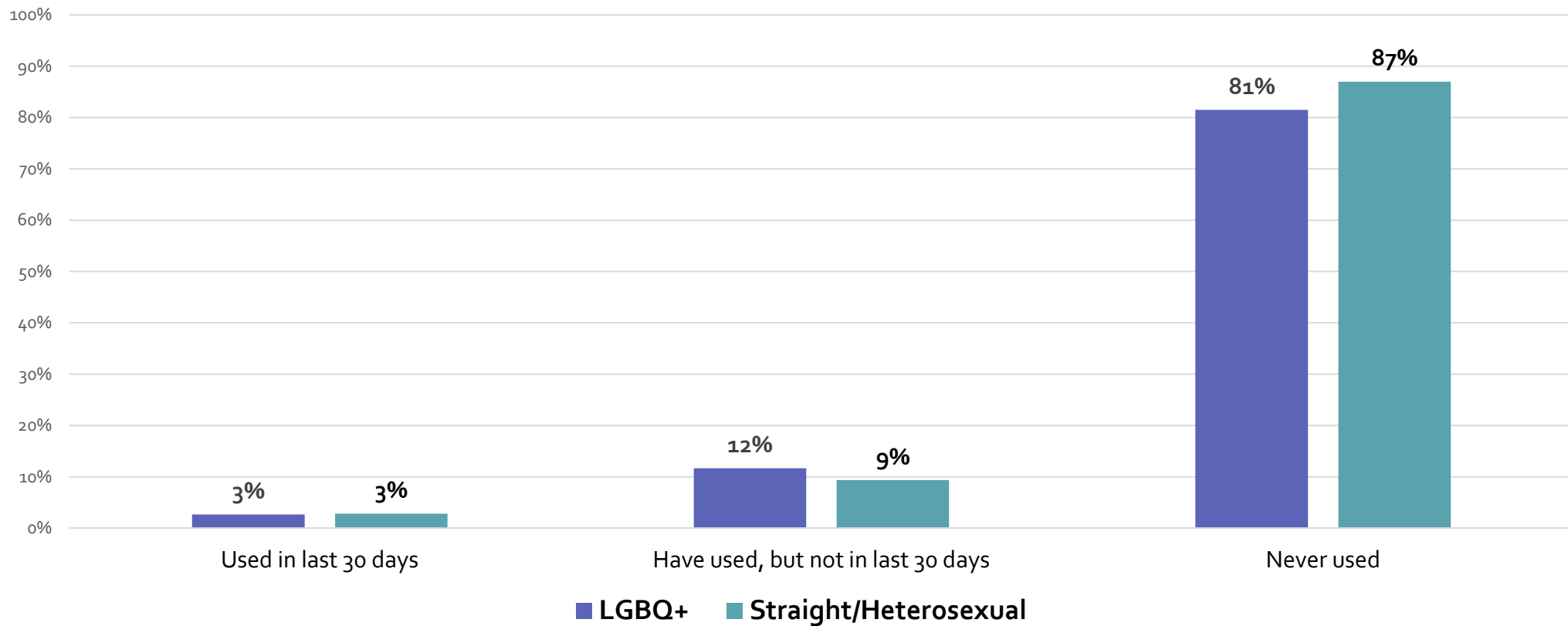
Alcohol Use in Last 30 Days



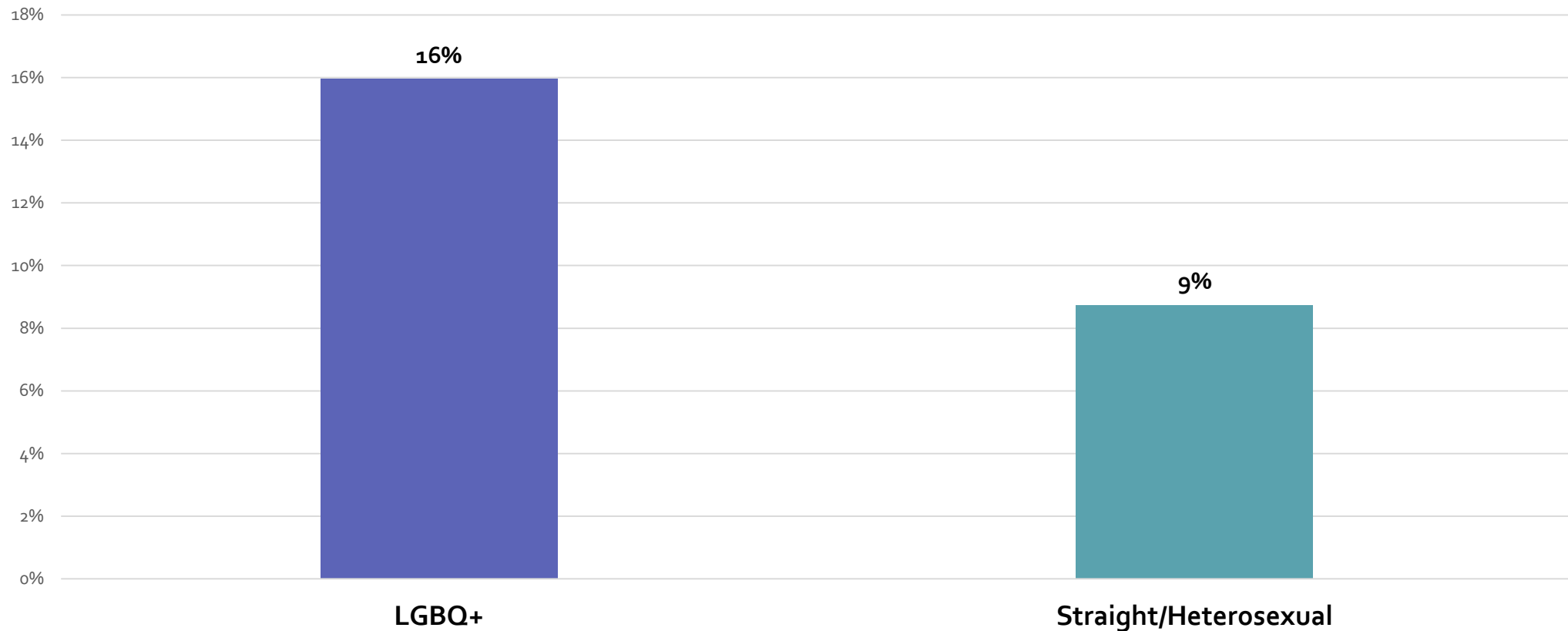
Marijuana Use in Last 30 Days



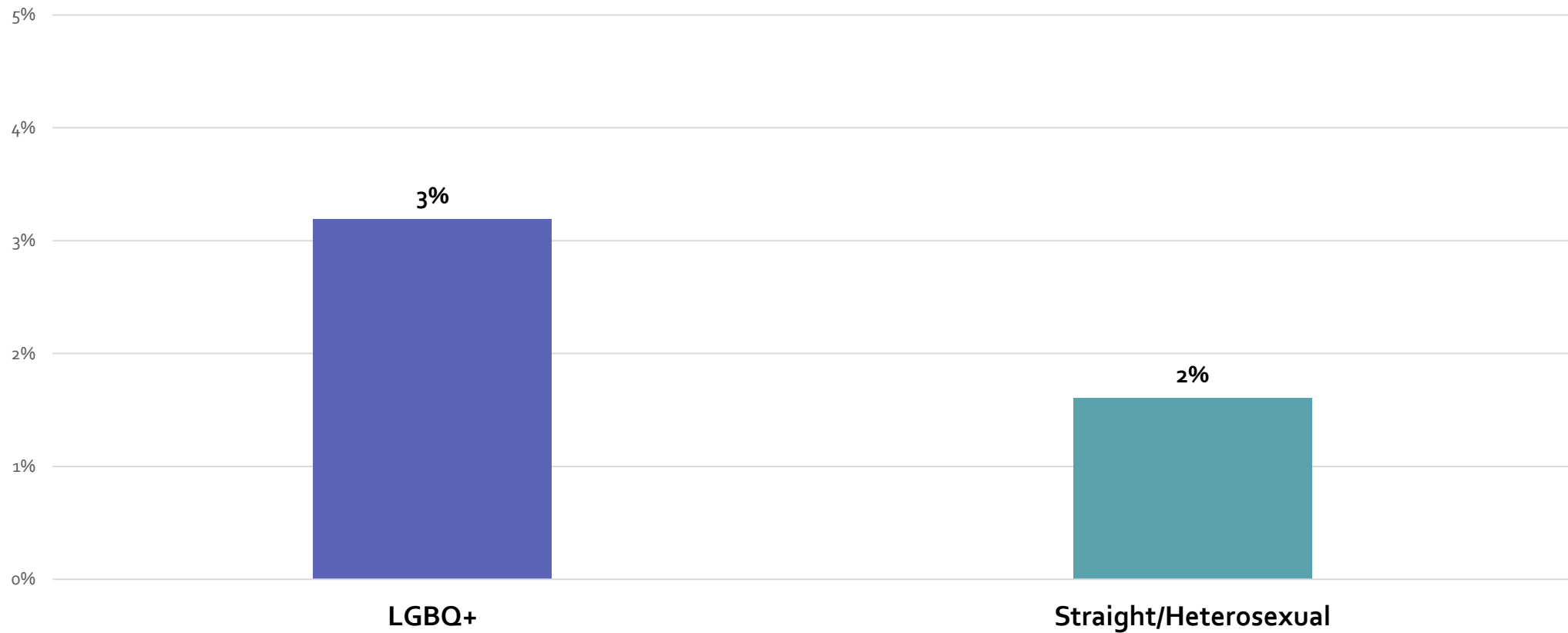
Cigarette Use in Last 30 Days



Last 12 months experienced when drinking-Had unprotected sex

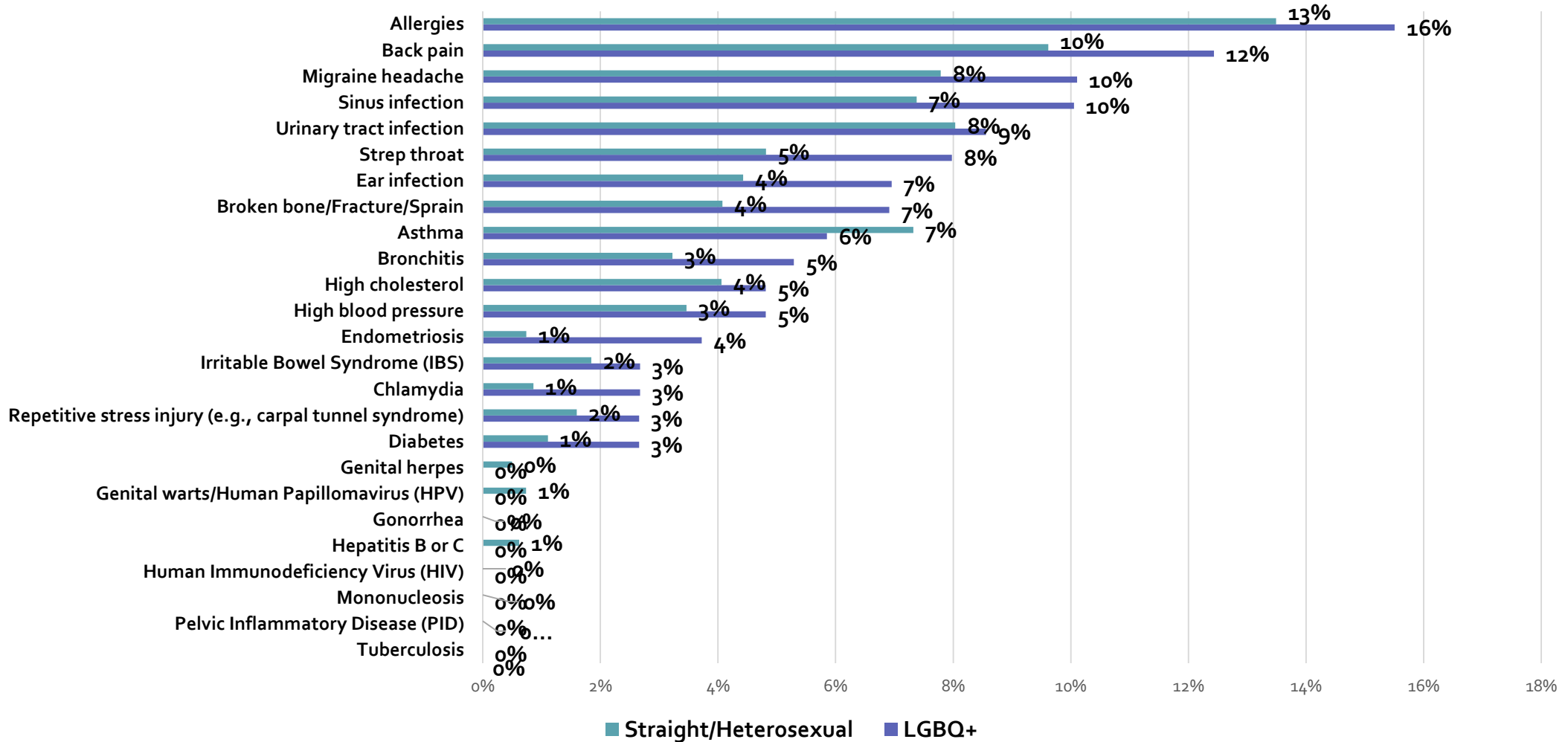


Last 12 months experienced when drinking-Seriously considered suicide

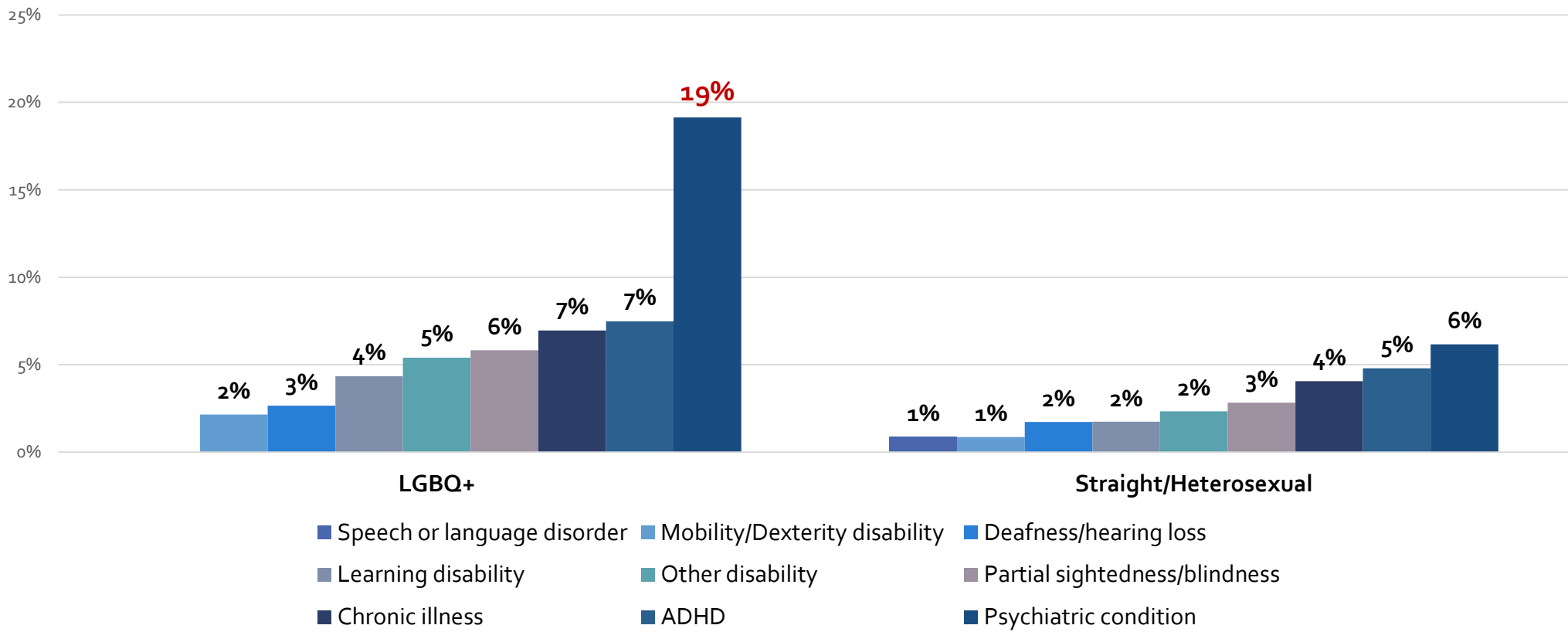

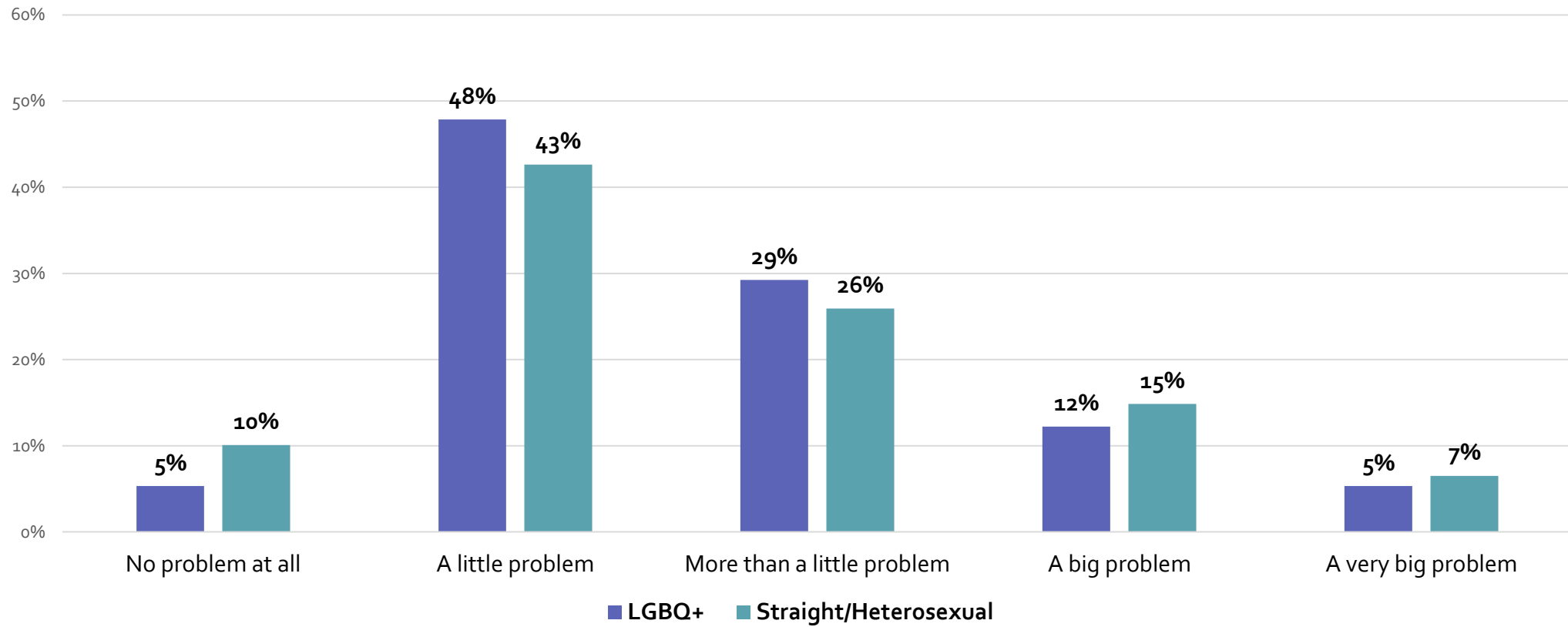
Diagnosed/Treated in Last 12 Months



Disabilities and Medical Conditions



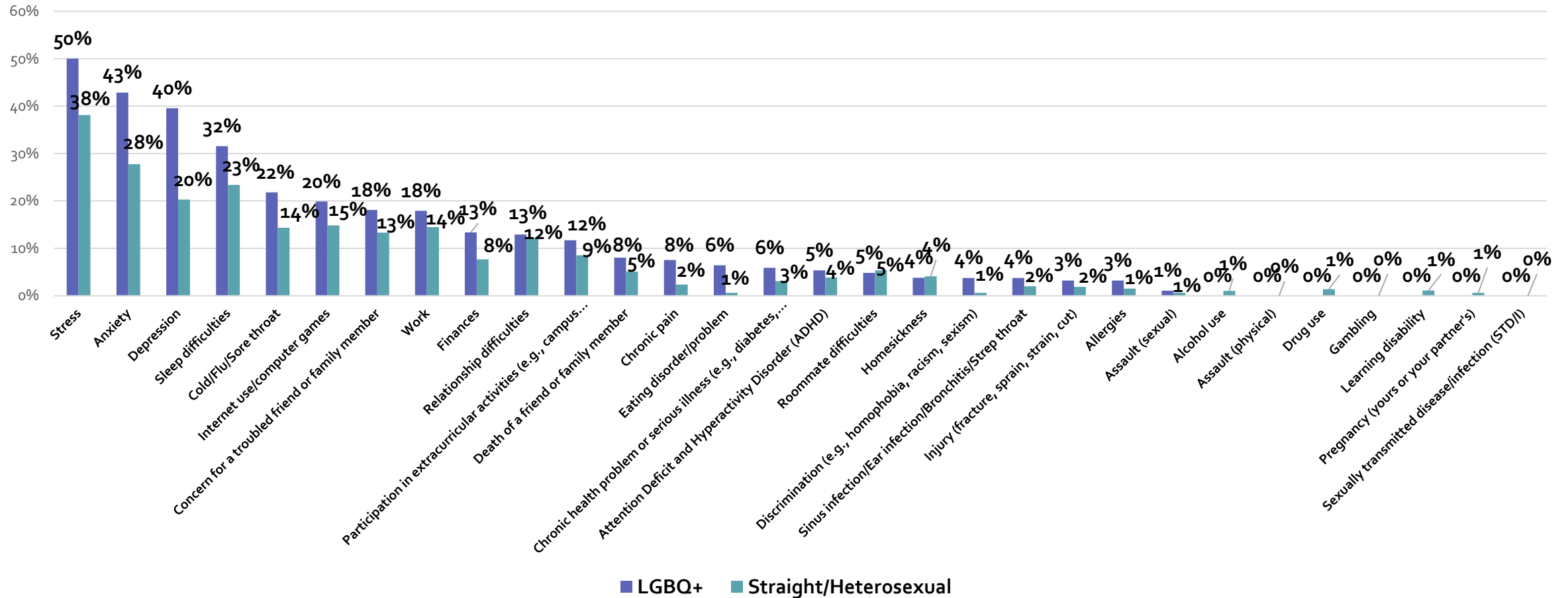
Sleep

Conclusion

- LGBTQ+ participants reported more negative results than straight/heterosexual participants, on average.
- LGBTQ+ participants felt less safe on/around campus and had higher rates of: sexual assault and abusive relationships, mental illness and suicidality, alcohol and marijuana use, physical illnesses, disabilities, and chronic medical conditions.
- Series of life difficulties affected LGBTQ+ respondents' academic performance more than straight/heterosexual respondents.
- These findings suggest that UCR LGBTQ+ students are marginalized and at high risk of mental and physical illnesses that impact their academic performance and general well-being.
