


University of California Undergraduate Experience Survey (UCUES) 2016 UCR Results – Highlights

- **29%** of UCR students completed UCUES (N=5,196) compared to 33% of students UC system-wide (N=63,115).

Campus Climate for Diversity & Inclusiveness:

- **93%** of UCR students agreed with the statement “Overall, I feel comfortable with the climate for diversity and inclusiveness at this university,” compared to 82% of students UC-wide.

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
- **31%** of UCR students strongly agreed with the statement “This campus values diversity,” compared to 19% of students UC-wide.
- **91%** of UCR students agreed with the statement, “Students of my race/ethnicity are respected on this campus,” compared to 83% of students UC-wide.*
- **93%** of UCR students agreed with the statement, “UC Riverside is a welcoming campus,” compared to 88% of students UC-wide.*
- **91%** of UCR students agreed with the statement, “Students of my gender are respected on this campus,” compared to 88% of students UC-wide.* Note: the majority of UCR and UC-wide survey participants identified as female.

- **86%** of UCR students agreed with the statement, “This campus values students’ opinions” compared to 82% of students UC-wide.

Satisfaction

- **84%** of UCR students, compared to 73% of students UC-wide, agreed with the statement, “Top campus administrators are genuinely committed to promoting respect for and understanding of group differences at UC.”


Top campus administrators are genuinely committed to promoting respect for and understanding of group differences at UC



- **82%** of UCR students, compared to 79% of students UC-wide, were satisfied with their overall academic experience.
- **78%** of UCR students, compared to 74% of students UC-wide, were satisfied with their overall social experience.
- **76%** of UCR students, compared to 69% of students UC-wide, agreed with the statement, “I feel valued as an individual at this institution.”

Financial Aid:

- **63%** of UCR students reported receiving a Pell grant, compared to 48% of students UC-wide.




- **91%** of UCR students reported applying for financial aid, scholarships, or grants, compared to 81% UC-wide.

Food Insecurity:

- **27%** of UCR students indicated that they often* “Skipped or cut the size of meals because there wasn’t enough money for food,” compared to 23% of students UC-wide.
- **50%** of UCR students indicated that they worried (often or sometimes) whether their food would run out before they got money to buy more, compared to 42% of students UC-wide.

Academic Experience

- **91%** of UCR students agreed UC has a strong commitment to undergraduate education, compared to 86% of UC-wide students in reference to their campuses.
- **65%** of UCR students rated their current ability to engage in research as “Very Good”, compared to 61% of students UC-wide when they started at their campuses. In addition, 28% of UCR students rated their ability to engage in research as “Very Good” when they started UCR, compared to 24% of students UC-wide when they started at their UC campuses.



Academic Engagement

- **63%** of UCR students reported often contributing to a class discussion compared to 57% of students UC-wide.
- **47%** of UCR students reported often asking an insightful question in class, compared to 40% of students UC-wide.
- **44%** of UCR students reported often doing a class presentation, compared to 35% of students UC-wide.

Time Allocation

- **23%** of UCR students reported spending over 20 hours per week attending classes compared to 19% of students UC-Wide.
- **18%** of UCR students reported spending over 20 hours per week studying compared to 22% of students UC-Wide.
- **16%** of UCR students reported spending over 20 hours per week using television, internet, and other media, compared to 13% of students UC-Wide.
- **12%** of UCR students reported spending over 20 hours per week with family compared to 6% of students UC-Wide.

Note: Agreement percentages include the sum total of Strongly Agree, Agree, and Somewhat Agree. Satisfaction percentages include the sum total of Very Satisfied, Satisfied, and Somewhat Satisfied. Often percentages include the sum total of Very Often/Often/Somewhat Often. Very Good percentages include the sum total of Excellent/Very Good/Good.
