


University of California Undergraduate Experience Survey (UCUES) 2018 UCR Results – Highlights

- **22%** of UCR students completed UCUES (N=4,381) compared to 33% of students UC system-wide (N=67,894).

Campus Climate for Diversity & Inclusiveness:

- **92%** of UCR students agreed with the statement “Overall, I feel comfortable with the climate for diversity and inclusiveness at this university,” compared to 83% of students UC-wide.




- **UCR students felt more respected* than students UC-wide based on the following characteristics:**

Disability or Condition	89%	85%


- **93%** of UCR students agreed with the statement, “UC Riverside is a welcoming

campus,” compared to 86% of students UC-wide.



Satisfaction

- **83%** of UCR students, compared to 76% of students UC-wide, agreed with the statement, “Top campus administrators are genuinely committed to promoting respect for and understanding of group differences at UC.”
- **83%** of UCR students, compared to 79% of students UC-wide, were satisfied with their overall academic experience.
- **77%** of UCR students, compared to 71% of students UC-wide, were satisfied with their overall social experience.
- **77%** of UCR students, compared to 70% of students UC-wide, agreed with the statement, “I feel valued as an individual at this institution.”



- **68%** of UCR students, compared to 63% of students UC-wide, were satisfied with the


value of their education for the price they are paying.

- **82%** of UCR students agreed with the statement, “I feel that I belong at this university,” compared to 78% of students UC-wide.

Academic Experience

- **91%** of UCR students agreed UC Riverside has a strong commitment to undergraduate education, compared to 87% of UC-wide students in reference to their campuses.
- **30%** of UCR students rated their current ability to work with people from other cultures/backgrounds as “Excellent”, compared to 18% of UCR students when they started at UCR. In addition, 25% of students UC-wide rated their current ability to work with people from other cultures/backgrounds as “Excellent”, compared to 15% of students UC-wide when they started at their UC campus.

"Excellent" Ability to work with people from other cultures/backgrounds




Academic Engagement

- **63%** of UCR students reported often contributing to a class discussion compared to 57% of students UC-wide.
- **55%** of UCR students reported often having a class in which the professor knew or learned their name, compared to 48% of students UC-wide.

- **50%** of UCR students reported often bringing up ideas or concepts from different courses during class discussions, compared to 44% of students UC-wide.
- **47%** of UCR students reported often asking an insightful question in class, compared to 40% of students UC-wide.
- **45%** of UCR students reported often communicating with the instructor outside of class about issues and concepts derived from a course, compared to 38% of students UC-wide.

Communicate with Instructor Outside of Class




- **42%** of UCR students reported often finding their courses so interesting that they did more work than was required, compared to 38% of students UC-wide.

Financial Aid:

- **61%** of UCR students reported ever receiving a Pell grant, compared to 47% of students UC-wide.

- **91%** of UCR students reported applying for financial aid, scholarships, or grants, compared to 79% UC-wide.

- **66%** of UCR students compared to 56% of students UC-wide agreed with the statement “Given the grants and scholarships, if any, that you receive, the total cost of attending this university is manageable.”

Food Insecurity:

- **27%** of UCR students indicated that they often “Skipped or cut the size of meals because there wasn’t enough money for food,” compared to 23% of students UC-wide.
- **45%** of UCR students, compared to 39% of students UC-wide, indicated that it was often or sometimes true that their food would run out before they got money to buy more.
- **50%** of UCR students, compared to 43% of students UC-wide, indicated that it was often or sometimes true that they couldn’t afford to eat balanced meals at least once during the past year.

Community & Civic Engagement


- **45%** of UCR students, compared to 42% of students UC-wide indicated they participated in community service off-campus.
- **89%** of UCR students and 89% of students UC-wide agreed that opportunities to develop their leadership skills while a UC student were important to them.
- **81%** of UCR students and 81% of students UC-wide agreed that opportunities to engage in community service while a UC student were important to them.
- **89%** of UCR students and 89% of students UC-wide agreed that opportunities to connect their academic work with community-based experience are important to them.

Sexual Misconduct

- **89%** of UCR students, compared to 82% of students UC-wide, agreed with the statement, “If someone reported sexual misconduct at UC Riverside, the report would be handled fairly.”
- **90%** of UCR students, compared to 85% of students UC-wide, agreed with the statement,


“If someone reported sexual misconduct at UC Riverside, the report would be taken seriously.”

- **85%** of UCR students, compared to 82% of students UC-wide, agreed with the statement, “If I or someone else experienced sexual misconduct, I know where to go to get help on campus.”



Student Life & Development

- **93%** of UCR students, compared to 86% of students UC-wide, agreed with the statement, “This campus values diversity.”
- **85%** of UCR students, compared to 79% of students UC-wide, agreed with the statement, “This campus values students’ opinions.”



Note: Agreement percentages include the sum total of Strongly Agree, Agree, and Somewhat Agree. Satisfaction percentages include the sum total of Very Satisfied, Satisfied, and Somewhat Satisfied. Often percentages include the sum total of Very Often/Often/Somewhat Often.
